Summer 2006 Grantees

- 11 grants
- \$608,450 awarded
- 6 month reports (January 2007)
- 10,686 lives touched
- 9 out of 11 meeting or exceeded goals
- 7 of 11 serving 70% or more racial and ethnic minorities

Summer 2006 Grantee: Area Agency on Aging of Broward

- 5,918 calls to Elder Helpline
- 103 frail elderly served
- 325 case management (includes SPMHP)
- 61 urgent care home visits
- 15% above target figures

Summer 2006 Grantee: Baptist Healthcare Foundation

- No-D Clinic addressing disparities in diabetes
- Coordinating with new HCAP grant to Department of Health
- Revised timeline and outcomes
- Site Visit May 18

Summer 2006 Grantee: Bayfront Medical Center

- Implement “Under The Tree” model
- 400 screenings; 300 1-to-1 consultations
- 66% show high blood pressure; 42% diabetic conditions
- 52 people enrolled in high blood pressure classes
- 95% ethnic minority patients

Summer 2006 Grantee: Child Guidance Clinic

- Begin 4 art therapy studios for children who are abused or traumatized
- 189 children seen in studios
- Average 5.5 hours of art therapy/child
- 90% of yearly goal in first 6 months
- Open House for anonymous works May 25

Summer 2006 Grantee: Clara White Mission

- Mental Health assessment and treatment for residents of homeless shelter and program
- Mental Health assessment and treatment for participants in vocational training program
- Health Screenings for residents and vocational training participants
- 129 residents; 135 in vocational training
- 86% African-American population

Summer 2006 Grantee: Clara White Mission

- 68% of residents receiving regular mental health treatment have remained independent housing for at least 12 months
- 65% of students completing vocational training and receiving mental health treatment have sustained employment for at least 12 months
- 72% of those successfully completing the housing and/or training program(s), and who have received mental health treatment have remained drug-free after 12 months
- 91% of students receiving medical treatment/referral for an acute condition have graduated and acquired employment
- 65% of students receiving medical treatment/referral for an acute have retained employment after 6 months
- 57% of students receiving treatment/referral for a chronic medical condition have graduated and acquired employment
- 48% of students receiving treatment/referral for a chronic medical condition have retained employment after 6 months
- 65% of residents receiving medical treatment/referral for an acute condition will acquire permanent housing
- 44% of residents receiving medical treatment/referral for a chronic medical condition will acquire permanent housing

Summer 2006 Grantee: Healthy Start Coalition of Jefferson/Taylor/Madison Counties

- Group Peri-Natal Care and Lifeskills Program
- 19 women graduated from the program
- 16 had delivered
- No low birth weight babies; no premature babies; no infant deaths
- 100% African-American women

Summer 2006 Grantee: Heartland Rural Health Network

- Mobile outreach to new communities:
Highlands, Hardee, and DeSoto Counties
- 380 new clients seen in 6 months
- 57 children with no medical home
- Also County Health Department personnel
- Patients logged into Medical Information System

Summer 2006 Grantee: Hispanic Health Initiative

- Diabetes Education and Prevention
- HOY en Adelante – Diabetes Prevention and Education through theater
- 2000 people touched through outreach efforts (69% show high blood pressure)
- 119 attending prevention/education classes
- First performance 70 attendees

Summer 2006 Grantee: Palm Beach County Medical Social Services

- Project Access to facilitate access to medical care for uninsured in county
- 363 new patients screened
- 49% Hispanic; 21% Black; 30% Other
- 125 signed up for Project Access
- 238 signed up for public program (SCHIP, Medicaid)
- 108 new physicians

Summer 2006 Grantee: Thelma Gibson Health Initiative

- HIV/AIDS Outreach and Education
- 606 Outreach contacts; 177 tested
- 121 returned for counseling (68%)
- 172 open cases
- 87% Black; 10% Hispanic; 3% Other

Summer 2006 Grantees: University of South Florida FINK Program

- Implement the Florida Improvement Network for Kids
- Change in personnel: lead PI left project
- New co-PIs: Sharon Dabrow, Ph.D. and Denise Edwards, Ph.D.
- Childhood Obesity chosen as first condition
- 12 expert panel chosen; soliciting participants

Winter 2005 Grants

- 9 Programs
- \$582,108
- 1 year reports
- 4933 lives touched
- 7 of 9 projects meeting or exceeding goals
- 6 of 9 serving >90% racial and ethnic minorities

Winter 2005 Grantee: ARC Broward

- Mental Health awareness and outreach for people with disabilities and caregivers
- 150 individuals assessed; 47 professionals trained
- 60 individuals in counseling; 25 in group counseling
- 85% demonstrated an increase in knowledge about mental health issues (disabilities workers) or disabilities issues (mental health workers)

Winter 2005 Grantee: Florida Heart Research Institute

- Heart Disease education and intervention in Pan-African churches
- Connected to Super Bowl XLI Kickoff to Better Health Campaign
- Significant start-up delays
- First session – 60 people enrolled
- Significant results on heart rate, blood pressure, cholesterol for participants

Winter 2005 Grantee:

Good Samaritan Health Clinic of Pasco

- Restorative dental care clinic as part of health clinic
- 103 adults seen for restorative work
- Cavities filled, teeth capped, root canals completed, orthodontry initiated, bridges and dentures installed
- 103 relieved and happy patients

Winter 2005 Grantee: Hamilton County Council on Aging

- Hamilton County Pharmacy Assistance Program instituted
- 259 Clients served
- 86% under 150% FPL income
- 59 Assisted with Medicare Part D applications
- \$91,547.44 of medication obtained

Winter 2005 Grantee: Lee's Place

- Grief and trauma counseling for children
- 62 children seen for grief counseling
- 32 trauma victims receive counseling
- for 85% daily functioning increased
- 75% school performance increased
- 74% of adults work performance increased

Winter 2005 Grantee: March of Dimes Birth Defects Foundation

- New MOM mobile
- Delay in accessing full funding for mobile unit
- Locating vendor to outfit mobile unit
- Vendor designing and outfitting van with medical equipment
- Preparing for launch April 28, 2007...

Winter 2005 Grantee: Migrant Association of South Florida

- Caridad Center Diabetes Screening and Treatment Program
- 859 individuals screened:
 - 692 adults and 167 children
- 139 referred with risk factors:
 - 120 adults and 19 children
- 75 confirmed diabetic:
 - 66 adults and 9 children

Winter 2005 Grantee: Migrant Association of South Florida

- 109 Patients enter the Diabetes Treatment and Management Program
- 21 enter additional Nutritional Education Program
- 22 enter family counseling program
- 45 Certificates of Completion
- 100% Hispanic population

Winter 2005 Grantee: St. Vincent's Foundation

- Mobile Health Outreach Project to rural St. Johns county
- 2600 adults and 700 children received medical care
- Acute and preventive services
- Partnering with County Health Department and local clinics
- 77% racial and ethnic minorities

Winter 2005 Grantee: UF Speech and Hearing Clinic

- Speech pathology and hearing services for the uninsured
- 27 individuals given assessment and treatment
- 175 treatment sessions
- transportation vouchers offered
- 57% White; 30% Black; 10% Hispanic; 3% other
